Attendance at School



The *Education Act (1990)* requires parents to ensure that children of compulsory school age attend school on each day that the school is open for instruction. If children are absent from school, parents are required to provide the school with an acceptable explanation within seven days of the absence.

Reminder notes are automatically generated from the school's data system to parent and carers about unexplained absences. You are kindly requested to return the slip to the school so that the roll can be updated with a reason for your child's absence. Exemptions for attendance due to travel overseas or extended medical issues, can be applied for from the school's office in person or by phone request.

I am obliged to report apparent unresolved noncompliance with the *Education Act (1990)* to the local manager of the region's Home School Liaison Program.
